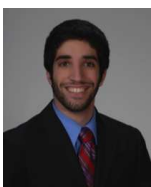

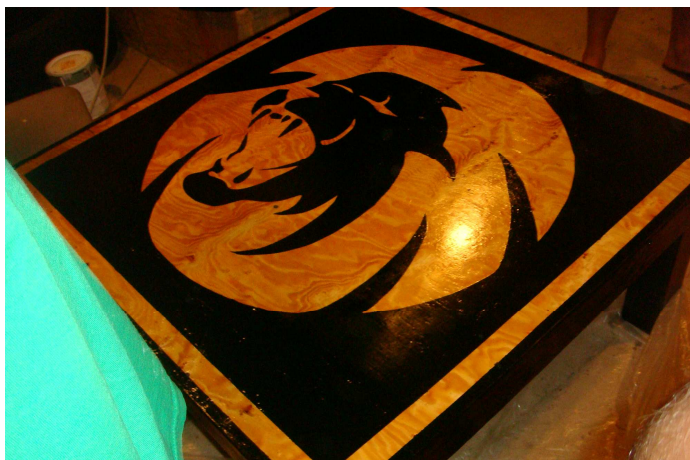

From the LAE Chairman: “Jerry” Witter ‘82

LAE has been busy again with managing both physical plant issues as well as mentoring the undergraduate leadership. RPI Greek Life continues to evolve with social, recruitment, and housing. There may be changes to require sophomores to live in “campus” housing and for now Greeks are in that mix, but may require us to do our billing through the bursar in order to allow students to maintain a shift to housing grants for financial aid. Despite what RPI puts out in publications, some of RPI’s actions continue to make it challenging to maintain a vibrant fraternity experience.

For the house maintenance we’ve contracted another \$26,000 of work for the third floor and middle head bathrooms, floor refinishing, driveway patches, and main roof repair. We are continuing the strategic planning work of the SAE 2011 committee to make sure we are prepared for NYEP housing issues beyond our 50 years at 12 Myrtle Avenue. In 1989 we had the SAE 2000 task force that helped set the stage for many years of LAE actions. We need a new guiding plan for the future. Annual LAE Board/ Executive Council Retreat

The chapter leadership and LAE board met for the 7th year at Mark Wilensky’s ‘96 summer house on the coast of Maine. LAE Phonathon 2008

The results to date for the 2008 phonathon have \$18,590 collected of the \$22,000 pledged. This is from 140 donors, with another 60 potential donors still out there. 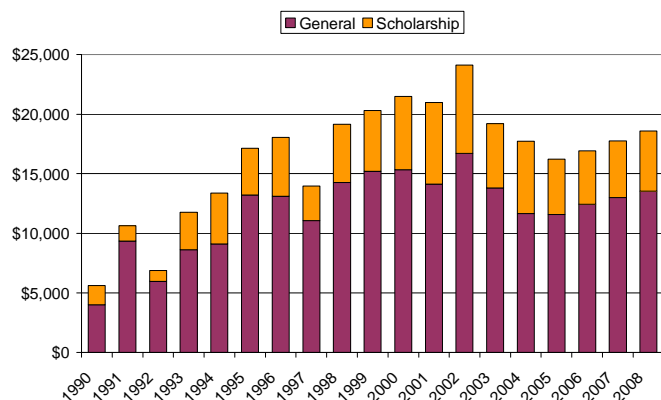

Classes of 53, 58, 63, 68, 73, 78, 83, 88, 93, 98, and 2003 make an effort to come back for your 5 year anniversaries!

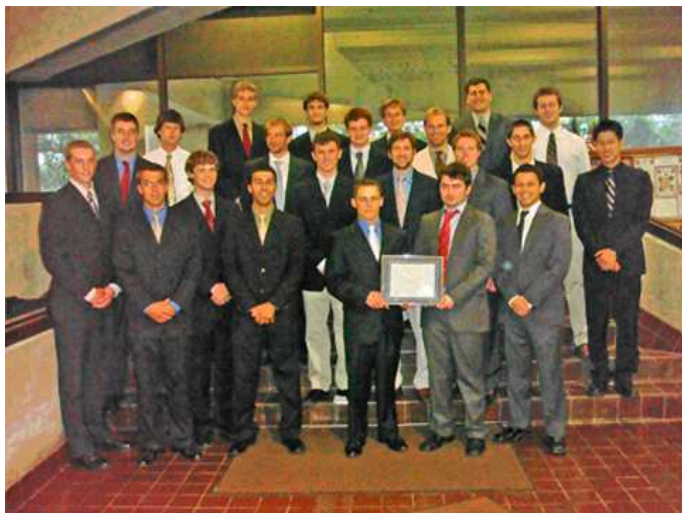

Ways to Support NYEP while helping SAE and RPI

We have a Chapter Endowment Fund at National called the “Don Farkouh/Mark Hier Memorial Fund for New York Epsilon” that supports sending undergraduates to National Leadership School. Currently it has \$7500 in it and has been somewhat stagnant except for some LAE donations to it. We can use up to 6% each year for scholarships, but it can't drop below \$5000. If you are thinking of donating to National, keep this fund in mind.

You can support Greek Life at RPI and get an RPI donation credit to boot. The OFSA Dean is meagerly funded at \$4000 – less than 1/10 the cost of one student to attend RPI. Earmark a donation your company match to support Greek Life to “Office of Fraternity and Sorority Affairs.”

SAE 2011 Task Force

Last fall we kicked off a task force to review the housing situation for NY Epsilon. The teams reviewed the SAE 2000 report and strategies implemented for LAE. Not a lot of work has been done, but we'd like to increase the efforts as we head to our 50th year at 12 Myrtle Avenue. We have completed around \$350,000 of projects since that road map was established and now it is the time for a new road map.

The primary tasks of the 3 sub-groups are to address:

- Needs for Modern Fraternity Housing
- Long Term Funding Strategies
- Lessons Learned from others renovation projects
