
With the season of giving and perpetual hope upon us, we are reflecting on such questions and all that we are thankful for, including the support of the NY Epsilon brotherhood.

We thank the 117 donors for their generosity and unwavering support of the place that helped us grow into capable leaders in college and beyond. And to those who have delayed your support, we hope you'll look back at your ΣAE experience and see what lifelong gifts it has given you. Remember, all donors who pledge \$2,500 or more will have their name included on a plaque permanently displayed in the newly renovated chapter house.

To date, 13% of our alumni base has expressed their gratitude for their ΣAE experience by supporting the *Preserving Our Past, Providing for Our Future* campaign, but we must see an increase in alumni support before we can break ground. The average participation in Greek campaigns is 25%, and we strongly feel that this is an attainable goal for our campaign.

Closing the gap between signed pledges and the campaign goal balance of \$552,920 is imperative to providing our chapter with solid financial footing and reducing the burden of debt incurred by construction costs. We must raise these remaining dollars—we need your attention and action right now. If 200 alumni could commit to giving \$500 per year for the next five years, it would bring us a long way to meeting the gap and allow us to be better positioned to accomplish the full scope of the project, rather than scaling it back.
