Brothers, the past year has been full of challenges from the House Corporation perspective. We have seen a few problems with the Troy community & our neighborhood, as well as a number of issues with our aging house. Through all this our tight relationship with the undergrads has helped us to quickly remedy most of the issues, and shown us how we can further improve communication to allow for faster resolution in the future.

The chapter has had instances of vandalism, theft, and breaking & entering over the past semester. LAE takes the safety of our undergrads very seriously and are taking steps to improve the security in and around the house. Motion detector lights will

be setup in the driveway to monitor cars parked there, door locks will be reinforced, and the main door locks will be upgraded to electronic keypad locks. We are looking at increased security measures and enhanced cooperation with Troy PD and Public Safety to ensure the safety of chapter members and their guests.

Our chapter house has definitely seen better days. We have had to spend a large amount of money this past year to keep the structure up to code and provide infrastructure to let the undergrads run day-to-day operations. Expenditures include refinishing the wood floors, refurbishing a number of the bathrooms, and multiple fixes to plumbing problems as they occur. Near future items include new washers & dryers, an overhaul of the fire alarm system, and a full evaluation of the plumbing system. To this end we are considering not making our annual Lions Fund contribution to ensure we have the house up and running to maintain membership numbers.

Our phonathon this year will be extremely important. Please get together with members of your class or other classes and attempt to sponsor one of our improvements so we can continue to provide a high quality of life and attract the best the RPI undergraduate community has to offer. I look forward to seeing many of you at alumni weekend this spring.

SAE Launches Capital Campaign to Advance Fraternity

At the fall alumni weekend, Don Parsons of the SAE Foundation presented an overview of the Campaign to Advance SAE. Their plan is in 5 years to raise \$28.5M for 210 chapters. This will be focused to 6 key initiatives with most going back to chapters in the form of support programs like EA leadership school, endowed funding of delegates to Leadership School, and volunteer education. Each chapter is targeted to raise \$125,000. Don and Jerry took an initial look at how that may be possible. Though daunting, it appears if we can create a pyramid of donors we can help reach the chapter goal that National has set. We need over five years 2-\$10,000, 2-\$7500, 5-\$5000, 25-\$1000, and 31-\$500 donors. This can be supported in various ways (stocks, insurance, estate, etc.) but direct donations are the best. We have a Chapter Endowment Fund at National called the "Don Farkouh/Mark Heir Memorial Fund for New York Epsilon" that supports sending undergraduates to National Leadership School.
